How to help those affected by the Moore tornado

Red Cross

The Oklahoma Red Cross is asking people to donate by texting Red Cross to 90999 to make a \$10 donation, spokesman Ken Garcia said.

Garcia said the donations allow the Red Cross to purchase needed supplies.

A shelter has been opened at St. Andrew's Church at Southwest 119th Street and May Avenue in Oklahoma City. The city of Oklahoma City is also using the location as a reunification site.

The National Red Cross will be moving in 20 response vehicles to provide food and distribute relief items, Garcia said. Trailers with additional supplies are also being mobilized.
